

**Churches Together in Hemel Hempstead**  
**AGM 26-07-07 South Hill Church 7-45pm**

1. The Chair G Richardson welcomed all including new attendees and led in worship and prayer.
2. Apologies were received from B Newton, J Jackson, Camille Fidgett, P Cotton, Sue Allen.
3. Minutes of the meeting 08-06-07 had been distributed. Headings were read out and then signed as accurate.
4. There were no matters arising
5. Treasurers Report. Chris Jones distributed a paper. We are solvent. Subs were 23 x £40 =£923 Subs to others £12 per member goes to Herts CT and insurance. Good Friday cost £151. i.e. £50 bandstand, buns £71, Jackets £26. To cover this cost, a box for a voluntary offering for such expenses offered to all churches with the annual subs request. All Agreed.  
We collect subs Jan-Dec but the Accounts are April/March. Proposed subs be April/ March also. All agreed Brian Boggis offered an auditor for next years accounts. Report received with thanks.
6. Directory. Churches have all received on and an update. We can not go public as we wish without written consent from all churches. Churches have not been replying to our request for this. We will persevere or put out directory with gaps.
7. Chairman's report. As distributed. GR also showed DVD Hope2008. [www.hope2008.com](http://www.hope2008.com). Arno offered to be co-ordinator for CTHH for those who wanted to be involved in Hemel. He has contact through the directory.
8. Crossover Report. Description of youth workers, school clubs, Alpha, assemblies and class work in Hemel given. Dean Such is moving to Bolivia after 8 years with Crossover. The post is advertised and it is hoped to be appointed soon.
9. Dens. Andrew L. 10 years running. Thanks to churches for prayers, volunteers, up to 130! And donations. There are 12 F/T equivalent staff. Last year a shortfall of £17 K. Happy to give a presentation to any church or group.
10. Mustard Seed. Francis spoke of the support MS gives to people in Hemel. Please consider ordering non Christian books through the MS. Gifts enabled MS to balance the books again. CTHH can have 2 members on the Management committee. Meeting 6 times p.a. Not appointed.

11. Town Centre Chaplaincy Robin not present. Access to the new Round House in the Town Centre available to all CTHH people. Robin now salaried for 6 hours per week, as co-ordinator. Loretta is a volunteer police chaplain with GR. There are plans to appoint an Anglican Chaplain at the Hospital to lead the volunteers there.
12. Youth Forum. This network meets. No report available.
13. Pray Hemel. Penny C reported doing well. Has helpers, been to the Mustard seed, done a prayer walk, 7<sup>th</sup> July at Hemel School, future led by Dens, Crossover and Gideons. 24/7 prayer. Vaughan believes there has been a spiritual coming together, there was almost 6 months of prayer. The future? Needs some thought. A 24/7 DVD is available.
14. Discovery. Andrew said future children will not know the Gospel.. Not so in Hemel. He visits 28 schools and has given away 720 x 2 bibles. At £5 each copy =£7,200 pa. Statement distributed.
